Whiff of fresh air...

"Sisodia has been deprived of the right to speedy trial. Right to speedy trial is a sacrosanct right. Recently,

in Javed Gulam Nabi Shaikh case, we dealt with this angle and noted that when court, state or agency cannot protect the right to speedy trial, then bail cannot be opposed saying that crime is serious. Article 21 applies irrespective of the nature of the crime." the Bench held.

Justice Gavai said the objective of denying bail was to ensure attendance of the prisoner during trial; however, there was no flight risk in Sisodia's case since he had "deep roots" in the country.

"Regarding the possibility of tampering with evidence, the case largely depends on documentation and it is all seized and there is no chance of tampering," the court further said while allowing bail. The Supreme Court further said that High Courts and trial courts appear to be "playing it safe" when they routinely deny bail in criminal cases instead of treating the grant of bail as the norm.

The court also turned down the ED's argument that the delay in trial was due to various applications filed by Sisodia himself before the trial court. The Apex Court also said that it will not relegate Sisodia to trail court or High Court again for bail since the apex court while rejecting his earlier bail plea, had granted liberty to Sisodia to approach the top court for bail after the filing of chargesheet.

SC stays Mumbai college fiat banning hijab

NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Friday stayed a Mumbai college's decision banning 'hijab, burqa, cap and nagab' on the campus and said girl students must have the freedom to choose what they wear.

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Sanjay Kumar came down heavily on the Chembur Trombay Education Society, which runs the 'N G Acharya and DK Marathe College' for issuing such a circular and asked whether it would ban 'bindi' and 'tilak' also.

During the hearing, Justice Kumar asked senior advocate Madhavi Divan, appearing for the society, how was the college empowering the girl students by issuing such a

You have suddenly woken up to the fact that they are wearing it and come out with instructions. It is unfortunate. After so many years of Independence, you have come to know there are so many religions in this country.

"How are you empowering the women by telling them what to wear? I think it's less said the better. Where is the freedom of choice for the women? Where is freedom of choice of what to wear to the girl students? Educational institutions should not force their decisions on the girl students on what to wear," said Justice Kumar.

Divan contended that the college is a co-educational institution and the intention behind the directive is to ensure that the religious faiths of the

students are not revealed.

The lawyer said the circular was not limited to 'hijab, burqa or nagab' but extended to even ripped jeans and other such

Justice Unimpressed, Khanna asked "Will the students' names not reveal their religious identity? and added "Religion is in their names also. Do not impose such rules. Justice Kumar further observed, The bench issued notice to the education society and sought its response by No-

"We partly stay clause 2 of the impugned circular to the extent that it directs that no hijab, no cap, no badges will be allowed in the campus. We hope and trust this interim order is not misused by anybody," the bench ordered.

It granted liberty to the educational society and the college to approach the court in case of any misuse of the order.

Senior advocate Colin Gonsalves and advocate Abiha Zaidi, appearing for the petitioners, including Zainab Abdul Qayyum, submitted that students were not able to attend the classes due to the cir-

Pollsters' projections also suggest that the ruling BJP would have to exert more to muster numbers needed to have a majority on its own.

Riding on the Modi wave, the saffron party had formed a government with 47 MLAs in 2014 and had 40 MLAs in 2019 while the rival Congress which had 15 MLAs in 2014 had 31 MLAs in 2019

In the recently held Lok Sabha elections, it was seen that Congress had the upper hand in 46 assembly segments and BJP in 44.
